

DRIVING DIRECTIONS TO

The Nature Conservancy MOSES COULEE FIELD STATION (Whisper Lake Lodge)

375 Moses Coulee Road, Ephrata WA 98823

FROM WENATCHEE:



- From US Hwy 2 & WA Hwy 28 junction, drive north on US Hwy 2/US Hwy 97 toward Orondo.
- At Orondo, bear right, staying on Hwy. 2 toward Waterville/ Spokane.
- Continue on Hwy. 2 (through Waterville and Douglas) approximately 22 miles to the junction of Hwy. 2 and Moses Coulee Road, on your right in the bottom of the Coulee. (Mile marker 170)
- Turn right (east/south) onto Moses Coulee Road/Coulee Meadows Rd.
 Drive 3.7 miles.
- Turn east (left) onto the gravel road at The Nature Conservancy's Moses Coulee Field Station sign. Drive 0 .75 mile. Go past the shop and up the hill. Park at wooden fence.

FROM EASTERN WASHINGTON via HWY 2:

- Travel west from Coulee City on Hwy 2 for approximately 20 miles to the junction of Hwy 2 and Moses Coulee Road, which will be on your left in the bottom of the Coulee. (Mile marker 170)
- Turn left (east/south) onto Moses Coulee Road/Coulee Meadows Rd. Drive 3.7 miles.
- You will see the sign for The Nature Conservancy's Moses Coulee Field Station on your left.
- Turn east (left) onto the gravel road at The Nature Conservancy's Moses Coulee Field Station sign. Drive 0 .75 mile. Go past the shop and up the hill. Park at wooden fence.

FROM SEATTLE OR SPOKANE via I-90 and Ephrata:

- Take I-90 West to the Othello/Moses Lake/Ephrata exit (#179).
- Turn right at the stop sign at the end of the exit ramp.
- Go approximately 0.3 miles and bear to the right onto WA Hwy. 17 North.
- Continue approximately 16 miles on Hwy. 17 until you can bear off to the left onto WA Hwy. 282.
- Continue for approximately 5 miles to Ephrata.
- At the junction of Hwy 282 and Basin Street/WA Hwy 28, turn right onto Basin Street/Hwy 28.
- Continue driving through Ephrata to 1st Avenue NW.
- Turn left onto 1st Avenue NW.
- Continue on this road for approximately 22 miles. This road will change names from 1st Avenue NW to Sagebrush Flats Road to Coulee Meadows Road to Moses Coulee Road.
- On your right, look for The Nature Conservancy Moses Coulee Field Station sign.
- Turn east (right) onto the gravel road at The Nature Conservancy's Moses Coulee Field Station sign. Drive 0 .75 mile. Go past the shop and up the hill. Park at wooden fence.
- Should YOU hit Highway 2 you missed us. Turn around and backtrack approximately 3.7 miles to the sign for the Field Station.
