Our state-wide conservation priorities guide our interest in proposed bills. Bills that we are currently monitoring include the following:

CLEAN ENERGY

- SB 6253 Establishing a clean, efficient, renewable energy standard. SUPPORT
- HB 2402 Concerning the energy independence act. UNDER REVIEW
- HB 2283 Encouraging investment in and reducing the costs of transitioning to the clean energy future. SUPPORT
- HB 2347 Requiring electric utilities to provide reports on the lowest cost, lowest risk options for a transition to a zero-carbon electric grid. UNDER REVIEW

CARBON PRICING

- SB 6203 Reducing carbon pollution by moving to a clean energy economy. SUPPORT
- <u>SB 6096</u> Establishing a carbon pollution reduction tax. UNDER REVIEW, 6203 more likely to move
- SB 6335 Creating a fossil fuel carbon pollution tax. UNDER REVIEW

LOW CARBON FUEL STANDARD

- HB 2338 Reducing the greenhouse gas emissions associated with transportation fuels.
 SUPPORT
- HB 2294 Aligning Washington's greenhouse gas emissions limits with those established by the United States' commitment under the 2015 Paris climate agreement. SUPPORT

 HB 2328 - Reducing emissions by making changes to the clean car standards and clean car program. SUPPORT

ATLANTIC SALMON NET PENS

- <u>SB 6086</u> Protecting the state's marine waters from the release of nonnative finfish from marine finfish aquaculture sites. SUPPORT
- NEW <u>HB 2956</u> Protecting Washington waters from negative impacts of nonnative finfish by requiring nonnative finfish cultivated in Washington to be single-sex. UNDER REVIEW, prefer HB 2957
- NEW <u>HB 2957</u> Reducing escape of nonnative finfish from marine finfish aquaculture facilities.
 SUPPORT
- HB 2418 Reducing impacts of nonnative finfish aquaculture by delaying construction of new nonnative finfish aquaculture facilities until thorough study, including structural analysis of existing facilities, is complete. UNDER REVIEW
- HB 2260 Prohibiting the spawning, incubation, and cultivation of Atlantic salmon in the marine waters regulated by the state. UNDER REVIEW

RANGELAND FIRE PROTECTION ASSOCIATIONS

- HB 2562 Concerning rangeland fire protection associations. SUPPORT
- SB 6548 Establishing the joint legislative task force on fire service administration. UNDER REVIEW
- NEW <u>SB 6575</u> Concerning protected lands not being assessed local fire district levies. UNDER REVIEW

SAFE OIL TRANSPORT

- HB 1611 Concerning oil transportation safety. SUPPORT
- HB 1210 / SB 5425 Strengthening funding for oil spill programs in Washington by increasing revenue to the oil spill prevention account. SUPPORT
- <u>SB 6269</u> Strengthening oil transportation safety. SUPPORT

MARBLED MURRELET CONSERVATION

- HB 2300 Creating a legislative task force to provide economic relief for communities impacted by environmental protections of the marbled murrelet. UNDER REVIEW, 2285 more likely to move
- <u>HB 2285</u> / <u>SB 6020</u> Establishing a reporting process for the department of natural resources regarding certain marbled murrelet habitat information. SUPPORT
