Our state-wide conservation priorities guide our interest in proposed bills. Bills that we are currently monitoring include the following:

CLEAN ENERGY

- SB 6253 Establishing a clean, efficient, renewable energy standard. (NTIB) SUPPORT
- HB 2402 Concerning the energy independence act. UNDER REVIEW
- HB 2283 Encouraging investment in and reducing the costs of transitioning to the clean energy future. SUPPORT

CARBON PRICING

- SB 6203 Reducing carbon pollution by moving to a clean energy economy. (NTIB) SUPPORT
- SB 6096 Establishing a carbon pollution reduction tax. NOT LIKELY TO BE VEHICLE THAT MOVES
- SB 6335 Creating a fossil fuel carbon pollution tax. NOT LIKELY TO BE VEHICLE THAT MOVES

ATLANTIC SALMON NET PENS

- <u>SB 6086</u> Protecting the state's marine waters from the release of nonnative finfish from marine finfish aquaculture sites. (passed the Senate and is in the House) SUPPORT
- <u>HB 2957</u> Reducing escape of nonnative finfish from marine finfish aquaculture facilities.
 (passed the House and is in the Senate) SUPPORT

RANGELAND FIRE PROTECTION ASSOCIATIONS

 SB 6548 - Establishing the joint legislative task force on fire service administration. (passed the Senate) SUPPORT

SAFE OIL TRANSPORT

- <u>SB 6269</u> Strengthening oil transportation safety. (**NTIB**) SUPPORT
- <u>HB 1611</u> Concerning oil transportation safety. SUPPORT
- HB 1210 / SB 5425 Strengthening funding for oil spill programs in Washington by increasing revenue to the oil spill prevention account. SUPPORT

MARBLED MURRELET CONSERVATION

 HB 2285 / SB 6020 - Establishing a reporting process for the department of natural resources regarding certain marbled murrelet habitat information. (HB 2285 passed the House and is in the Senate) SUPPORT
